SYNOPSIS

From Japanese special effects master Soichi Umezawa comes a singular horror experience in a wildly hilarious marriage of *The Blob* and *The Evil Dead*. Quickly outshining her jealous classmates, she soon becomes the star of the class when she discovers a bag of old, mysterious clay and uses it for sculpting assignments. SOICHI UMEZAWA



Soichi Umezawa began shooting independent films using an 8mm camera when he was thirteen years old. Self-studying special effects make-up in high school, he would begin creating moldings after graduation while working at the local movie theater as a projectionist. He continuously sent photos of his creations to Dick Smith and Rick Baker, two legendary Hollywood special effects make-up artists, who gave Umezawa advice. With Baker's recommendation, Umezawa started to work as a make-up artist in Japan. After five years of freelance work, Umezawa became independent and created his own company, Soychiume Co., Ltd. In 2013, he produced and directed a short independent film called *Middle*. It received recognition and he was selected as one of the directors for *ABCs of Death 2*. Afterwards, he produced couple of shorts and made his feature directorial debut with *Vampire Clay*.
